Dear Parents and Carers,

We have nearly come to the end of the school academic year, and your child's end of year report will be sent out to you next week. Together with some reports, will be a letter explaining statutory assessments that have taken place in certain year groups with your child's results.

A child in Reception is assessed against Early Learning Goals and is expected to attain a Good Level of Development. The children in Year one are assessed for their phonic attainment. There are statutory assessments at the end of Key Stage one and Key Stage two and finally, for the first year, children in Year four have recently been assessed for their knowledge of their times tables.

As a Parent/Carer, you will be informed regarding your child's achievement in these assessments, however, due to the impact of covid, the local authority and the Department of Education have agreed that these results will not be published.

After you receive your child's end of year report, please do not hesitate in contacting the school office on <u>office@stgprimary.org</u> if you wish to speak to your child's teacher to discuss any areas of their report.

We have organised some exciting trips/visitors for your child in recent months. Although it is an expectation for the class teacher to arrange these trips in good time, some establishments have been extremely slow in responding to our correspondences. Also, we have had many challenges with sourcing coaches too, therefore I do ask for your understanding regarding this matter.

This week, I sent a letter to you all about our Sports day arrangements. It would be lovely for you to join your child for a picnic lunch on their allocated day. Children in Reception and Key Stage one are entitled to a universal free school meal and will be provided with a packed lunch and the children who are entitled to a free school meal throughout the school, will also be provided with a packed lunch. Please remember your picnic, a chair or picnic blanket and we look forward to seeing you.

On Monday 11<sup>th</sup> July all the children will have the opportunity to spend the morning in their new class with their new teacher. I will send a letter home with each child updating you with the relevant information for September.

We have some changes in the staffing structure for the next academic year. We are saying goodbye to Miss Rachel Williams, our Early Years Practitioner in Nursery and wish her all the very best for the future. She is relocating to move closer to her family. Mrs Aimee Short, our Key Stage one Leader and Reading Leader has been an invaluable member of the senior leadership team, however, Mrs Short has decided to take some time out from teaching to spend some quality time with her family. All the family of St George's wish her well and thank her for all her support and hard work. We will be keeping in contact and hope to see her in the future.

Mrs Laura Tidmarsh, has completed her years sabbatical as a teaching assistant and is returning to her teaching position in Nursery. Furthermore, we welcome Mr Matthew Bell to the staff team at St George's for September. Mr Bell was a teaching student with Mrs Short for his final placement with the University of Worcester.

Over the past few months, we have been working collaboratively with the Worcestershire Diocese, the staff team, the children and the governing body to re-evaluate our school values and refine our school vision. Finally, this piece of work has been completed and I look forward to sharing the information with you in September.

A huge thankyou to the Year six children who have been doing a sterling job, redesigning our Spirituality Garden with Mr Modley. They have purchased some resources and actively been responsible for weeding and planting. I look forward to seeing the finished result, which I will share with you very soon.


#### Attendance JUNE 2022

### **NURSERY & TOTS**

Welcome to Tots and Nursery!

We have had lots of fun in Tots sharing the story 'Pirates Love Underpants'. We have made Pirate hats, painted wanted posters and painted ice cube gems. One morning, we arrived to find a treasure map with a big x to mark the spot of the treasure. Our first challenge was to match the patterns on the pants and, then, to set off on our quest. The map led us to our tree house on the school playground and inside we found a treasure chest; we had a think what could be in there? The children thought maybe a monkey, playdough, a lion or strawberries .... we opened it up, counting 1,2,3, and found ice-cream with sprinkles, cones and juice. The children really enjoyed the ice-cream treasure!





In Nursery we have been sharing pirate stories including The Night Pirates and The Pirate House. We have made treasure maps and taking them on adventures, sometimes we even found real pirate gold in our classroom. The children enjoyed making their own treasure chests and decorating them with treasure. The children counted the 'button' treasure and told us what colour and shape their treasure was... some children only wanted to have one colour treasure while others wanted the same shape but in lots of different colours. We looked at the plain cardboard boxes we had in our junk modelling box and decided to turn one into a treasure chest. The children painted it and added tissue to it using scissors and glue to stick it down.

Nursery have also started to brush their teeth before lunch every day. The children are enjoying showing us how they brush their teeth up and down and side to side, great job everyone! As well as this we have started to have lunch in the main hall on a Monday. The children sat and talked with their friends using marvellous manners while they ate their lunch with Reception on the table next to them.





#### RECEPTION

So far, we have had lots of fun exploring our new topic of 'What's special about Summer?'. The children have explored and discussed changes in weather during Summer and have looked forward to tracking the weather, using our daily weather chart. We have also talked about and shared our own experiences of Summer and the activities we might do during this season; such as going to the beach, making and eating ice lollies or building sandcastles. The children enjoyed making their own ice lollies to enjoy together!



In Literacy, one of the key texts we explored this month was 'The Three Little Pigs'. The children had lots of fun joining in with the repeated refrains from the story and they used puppets and masks to retell the story to adults and their peers. They also enjoyed working together to build houses using different materials, deciding how many children were allowed in each house and writing signs to alert everybody.



We also enjoyed going on our trip to Bell's Farm Shop. Despite not being able to pick any Strawberries, the children were still able to dig for and pick potatoes to take home! The children listened to how some fruits and vegetables are grown and were able to discuss where our food comes from. There were lots of different fruits and vegetables for us to look at, including; marrow, purple sprouting, cabbages, broccoli, rhubarb, apples, pears, plums, gooseberries and blackcurrants to name a few.

We have done so much already this term but have particularly enjoyed getting arty! We have created clay pots and enjoyed painting them in bright colours. As Scientists, we have planted seeds and not only learned what they need to grow but also used this knowledge to grow seeds in our home-made clay pots.



We have also learnt how to sew and used our skills to design and create beautiful, decorative bunting.



And finally, in Maths, we have been exploring capacity. We had great fun measuring the amount of water we had- especially as it was such a hot, sunny day!



The Year 2 Team

June has been another busy month here in Year 3. We have been on more educational visits and learnt lots back in school too. We started the term with another trip on the Severn valley railway where we were the first group of school children to ever take part in the trip. We learnt all about the navvies that built the railway, some of their language and a song. We also looked at forces (linked to our science unit) and how they were used to build the viaducts. (Not forgetting seeing animals from the safari park as a bonus too)



The following week we were lucky enough to get tickets to go to the Royal Three Counties Show. We survived the heat and saw a falconry display, motorcycle display team as well as a variety of animals. We especially enjoyed looking at the bees, spotting where the Queen was and watching the parachutests jumping out of the aeroplane.



In our Art lessons, we have practised creating a coil pot and pinch pot in preparation to design and make our own canopic jars linking to our Ancient Egyptian topic in history. The children will look at designs on pots back in Ancient Egypt and replicate this onto their own pot.



In English, we have travelled back in time and interviewed Howard Carter after he found the tomb of Tutankhamun in 1922 and we are currently writing up our interview in the form of a newspaper report.







In our Maths lessons we have recently completed our unit on money, where some children were able to visit our pop up shop and grab a bargain. We have now moved onto telling the time, which many children can struggle with, so any help asking your child to tell you the time would be apreciated to help with their current learning.



We have lots more to look forward to over the final few weeks of the summer term including our summer fayre and training for sports day as well as doing some sewing in our final DT unit.

In Year 4, we have been learning all about dragons! In their writing, the children explored the short video, 'Dragon Slayer' where we looked out inferring feelings and thought with how Tarragon was in front of an audience and when he was on his own. We looked further into describing the setting that he was in and how this gave us an insight into him as a character. After predicting what we thought would happen next in the video, we then had a dilemma! A baby dragon appeared so we used our drama skills (conscience alley) where we whispered to the person walking through, explaining if and why they should keep the dragon or not.



In maths, we have been learning about counting money, telling the time as well as reading different types of graphs. Our knowledge of times tables really helped us when looking at coins and different amount for example, if we had 3 lots of 5pence coins, we could do 3x15=15pence.

When we looked at telling the time, we found it quite tricky, but we have started to really understand how many seconds are in a minute, how many minutes there are in an hour and how many hours there are in a day. We looked at minutes too and past the hour as well as some problem-solving questions too.



In P.E we have been exploring the water with our weekly swimming lessons, improving our dance moves through our external provider 'Dance Xchange' as well as looking at athletics where we have been working on what we might expect on Sports Day!

Year 5 have really been making the most out of the beautiful weather this month!

In Reading, we have enjoyed exploring the story Tom's Midnight Garden by Philippa Pearce. During these sessions, we have walked in different characters shoes and have even gone down to the forest to walk through and visualise the midnight garden as Tom would.



In Writing, we have readdressed our purpose: to inform. We are starting to create a Queen Elizabeth II biography with links to the platinum jubilee. Our success criteria includes but is not limited to: using a formal tone, facts, brackets for parentheses, how to switch between the past tense and the present tense and many more. We have had to use and apply our internet safety rules and have independently carried out research about the Queen, supported by books we have at the library.

In Maths, we have started to develop our understanding of decimals and their relationships with fractions and percentages. We have also applied our written methods for addition and subtraction, concluding with us being able to add and subtract decimals with the same and different decimal places.

In Science, we are continuing to deepen our understanding of properties. We have especially enjoyed doing experiments within this topic area, including creating different solutions with flour, rice, sand, sugar and pepper to explore whether they are soluble or insoluble.



In Art, we have been exploring cross curricular links with our topic of The Ancient Mayans. We have recapped the different shading skills of stippling, hatching, cross-hatching and smudging to draw the famous Mayan temple 'Temple of Kukulcán' in Chichen Itza. After drawing, we then applied this to creating clay versions of the temple, we had a great time sculpting the clay (also a messy time).



We enjoyed going to the Arboretum this month with our STEM prototypes. We were fortunate enough to have time to do some sketching in the gardens, have a picnic at the park and compete in a competition of who could build the highest tower with sticks/twigs and marshmallows.



Thank you for your continued support over the previous weeks. Please ensure children continue to keep their PE kits in school and they are reading at home at least 3 times a week.


Miss Wellman and the Year 5 team! 😊
