#### **Message from the Head**

Dear Parents/Carer

The children have returned from their half-term break with positive attitudes and ready for new learning. It is going to be another busy half term and there are many things planned for the children before we break up for the summer.

I am so proud of the Year 6 children who have completed their Statutory Assessments in May. Throughout the year, the children have developed such positive learning behaviours and showed great resilience. These SATS are always challenging, but the children rose to that challenge, and they should be so proud.

Please be mindful that the children are busy preparing for their Sport's Day. It is essential that they bring to school their PE kits and suitable trainers/pumps so they can take part in these activities safely. Also, a gentle reminder regarding jewellery. Some children are choosing to wear a collection of bracelets, necklaces and very inappropriate earrings to school. Firstly, we do not want our children to lose these precious possessions but most importantly, they can be a health and safety hazard, and we do not wish that any of our children sustain any form of injury at school.








#### **RECEPTION**

It has been a really busy month in Year 1 and the children have really enjoyed their topic learning of 'Those who came before us.'

**English:** We have been reading the delightful story "Whatever Next!" by Jill Murphy. The children have enjoyed exploring the adventures of Baby Bear as he travels to the moon. We encourage you to ask your child about their favourite part of the story and discuss the imaginative journey Baby Bear takes.

**Maths:** In Maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division using the 2 times table. The children have been practicing their skills through various fun activities and games. You can support their learning at home by practicing the 2 times table together and using everyday objects to count in twos.

**History:** Our History lessons have been all about Neil Armstrong, the first person to walk on the moon. The children have been fascinated by his life and achievements. We have discussed the significance of his journey and how it has inspired many people around the world.

**Science:** In Science, we are identifying different plants and learning about the parts of a plant. The children have been exploring the school garden and observing various plants. They have learned about the functions of roots, stems, leaves, and flowers. Encourage your child to share what they have discovered and perhaps even start a small garden at home!

The children in Year Two have been involved in a range of activities throughout the half term where the children have been busy exploring various subjects and developing essential skills.

In Mathematics, the children have been diving into the world of numbers, working hard to find the most efficient method when working with all four operations—addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Through interactive lessons and fun exercises, they are building a strong foundation in maths that will serve them well in Year Three.

In Reading and Phonics, we have been using our phonics skills where the children have been using inference skills from the book "Fantastic Mr. Fox." This classic tale has sparked their imaginations and helped them enhance their reading comprehension abilities. It's wonderful to see them so engaged and excited about reading.

In writing, the children have been exploring "The Monster Machine." This book has inspired them to create their own stories and develop their writing skills. They are learning to express their thoughts creatively and effectively, and their progress is truly impressive.

The months are whizzing past in Year 3. We have been so busy being creative where we can and getting outside in forest school to enjoy the beautiful weather.

In English, we have written a short story using an image of a mammoth frozen in ice as our stimulus. We revisited using the correct punctuation for direct speech, writing in the past tense and using prepositions. In Maths, we have completed our unit on mass and capacity and a short unit revisiting fractions where we were adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator.

In Science we have been looking at forces and magnets and experimenting with different surfaces and we had a moment of spirituality – awe and wonder – when we explored the classroom with magnets.



In our RE lessons, we have started to explore the gospels which includes the story of the good Samaritan and when Jesus called his disciples. In our PE lessons, we have been improving our throwing and catching skills in preparation for sports day, and we are excited to be moving on to practising our athletics soon.

We have loved getting outside for forest school this month too, where we have created dens, charcoal art, explored for animals and the best of all, enjoyed some smores as well as nettles.



As we enter the final half term could you please remember to continue to read at home and send in your home link books to ensure your child is reading the books targeted at the correct level. Our PE lessons are Wednesday but could you please leave kits in school as we might go out for extra sports day practice this term. There are lots of exciting things to do in our final few weeks but as always if you do have any issues or questions, please do not hesitate to speak to us at the classroom door or contact us via the office.

It has been another busy month for the Year 4s! Mr Atkinson started it off by climbing the National Three Peaks alongside Miss Edwards, Mr Harris and other colleagues from the Black Pear Trust. We



raised over £600 for The Rotary Club which is a charity that supports schools across the country. The Bank Holiday Monday was certainly needed to rest the legs! The Year 4s showed their support alongside the rest of the school by walking the equivalent ascent of Scafell Pike on the field which they enjoyed very much!

The children loved wearing their red, white and blue and their picnic to mark the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VE Day. They learnt about its significance in an assembly and held a two-minute silence to remember those who died.

In our D.T lessons, the children have created a volcano



warning tower to house a siren and light. They gained inspiration from



electricity pylons to create a strong structure using a lattice effect. They then applied their knowledge of circuits which they have developed in their science lessons to create a warning light.

In our maths lessons, we have developed a good understanding of multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 and we have applied these to converting units of measure. We have had a lot of focus on times tables and the children have made fantastic progress with these! Please continue to practise these at home so that they can continue to develop their quick mental recall and fluency. In our writing lessons, we have written a narrative using inverted commas to indicate speech. The children based their story on the King of the Fishes in which a magical character grants their main character one wish. However, there is a problem: each member of their family wants something different!

May has been another action-packed month for Year 5, especially in PE! We've been making the most of our opportunities to get active and develop our skills in a variety of sports. One of the highlights has been our cricket sessions with the sports coaches, where the children have enjoyed learning how to bat, bowl, and field as part of a team. It's been fantastic to see their confidence and coordination grow with each session.

We've also continued our weekly *Get Fit* sessions with the Harriers, which are always a big hit! These fun and energetic lessons focus on staying active, building fitness, and learning about the importance of keeping our bodies healthy. There's even time for a bit of football at the end—something Year 5 always looks forward to!







In Design & Technology this term, Year 5 had a brilliant time designing and building a giant crane with a fully working pulley! This exciting project linked perfectly to our Science topic on Forces, where we've been learning all about levers, pulleys, and gears.

The children showcased their creativity and practical skills, using saws (safely!), lolly sticks, wood, and hot glue guns to bring their crane designs to life. We were especially proud of how sensible and responsible everyone was when handling the tools—real teamwork and maturity on display!

To finish off the project, we put our cranes to the test by seeing if they could successfully lift and lower objects—and they did! It was a fantastic hands-on way to bring our learning to life.

On Mondays, as part of our regular PE lessons, Year 6 have been developing their swimming skills at Holy Trinity School. During the first few sessions, the focus has been on front crawl and breathing techniques. In the coming weeks, the children will begin to work on their backstroke and build their stamina for swimming longer distances.

During the week of 12th May, our Year 6 pupils sat their SATs papers, covering SPAG, Maths, and Reading. They approached each test with focus, determination, and a positive attitude. 

- After school club starts at 3.15pm.
- There will be two slots available for the 'Little Pears'.
- The first slot will run from 3.15pm-4.30pm at a cost of £6.00.
- The second slot available is from 3.15pm-5.30pm Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Friday 3.15pm-5.15pm at a cost of £7.50.
- If your child is staying until **5.30pm**, they will be provided with a hot snack. Hot snacks e.g., 'beans or cheese' on toast.
